Natural Refrigerants From a Theoretical Point of View

What are natural refrigerants?

Natural refrigerants are substances that exist naturally in the environment. With zero ozone depletion potential (ODP) and very low or zero global warming potential (GWP), they are considered the definitive solution to the environmental damage caused by synthetic refrigerants.

The most widespread natural refrigerants used in HVAC/R applications today are carbon dioxide (CO₂, R-744), hydrocarbons such as propane (R-290), isobutane (R-600a) and propylene (R-1270), and ammonia (NH3, R-717). Other natural refrigerants are water (H₂O, R-718) and air (R-729), used only for special applications, or sulphur dioxide (SO₂) and methyl chloride (CH₃Cl), which are no longer used.

ASHRAE Government Outreach Day in Wisconsin

On February 28th ASHRAE members representing all four of Wisconsin's Chapters converged in the state capital of Madison to meet with lawmakers. The delegation, led by Victor Nino, Heather Kozlowski, Jason Boatman, Eric Erdman, and Jon Douglas ultimately met with 20 lawmakers or their staffers. They introduced the elected officials to ASHRAE, built invaluable relationships with their own elected officials, and offered their expertise on key issues. The topics discussed included efforts to update the state's energy standard for buildings to the latest version of ASHRAE Standard 90.1, phase down high-GWP refrigerants, and legislation that would provide grants for building energy efficiency in schools. Wisconsin's current legislative session will soon draw to a close, and with the Governor's ongoing lawsuit against the state legislature for blocking the commercial energy standard update and competitive elections in the fall on everyone's mind, this successful outreach event poises the Wisconsin government affairs chapter chairs for meaningful future success and deeper political engagement! ASHRAE Maine Conducts an Impactful Day on the Hill Event

On February 22nd ASHRAE members in Maine met in the state capital of Augusta to meet with their elected officials and other key members of the legislature. The team of government outreach volunteers was led by Rae Pinyard, PE, the Government Affairs Chair of ASHRAE's Maine Chapter. The group met with eight lawmakers, including party leaders, to introduce ASHRAE and to discuss how the state's commercial energy code and the other ASHRAE standards that Maine adopts have fallen out of date. Lawmakers were receptive to this message and have already begun involving ASHRAE in discussions on how to improve the situation, including increased funding for the state's code update council, and other administrative changes. Lawmakers shared that the opportunity to implement these changes will be in the state's budgeting and appropriations process next session, and expressed their hope that ASHRAE will contribute to that process. A follow up meeting has already taken place with the Governor's Office of Policy Innovation & the Future, which was organized at the request of lawmakers the group spoke with during their outreach event. 

2024 ANNUAL BACKWATER FISHING TOURNAMENT

Thank you for entering the Annual Southwest Florida Backwater Fishing Tournament hosted by the Southwest Florida Chapter of ASHRAE. The festivities this year will begin on Friday evening April 26th at Pinchers- Tarpon Point. The Captain's meeting will begin at 6:30 PM, which will be a cash bar social. We will discuss rules and regulations. One member from each fishing team is required to attend to register their boat and to pick up the tournament T-shirts and other information, and you will also get your tournament ruler.

Tournament Rules

This is a catch and release tournament

*1st-3rd Place will be determined by the LONGEST length of each individual fish. Snook, Redfish & Trout. (Not total combined length)

- For scoring, anglers will be required to take a picture of their catch on a tournament-provided ruler. Fish must be measured with the tail starting at the zero mark of the ruler. You will be able to text or email photos ahead of time to organizer no later than 2:30 NO EXCEPTIONS PENALTY WILL BE ENFORCED
- 2. No fishing before 7:00 AM. Teams may be on the water and catch bait or navigate to fishing holes prior to official 7:00 AM start.
- 3. This is an open bait tournament (live or artificial baits may be used).
- 4. Anglers are allowed to fish from any location desired.
- 5. All boats must stay 50 feet away from other vessels, with the exception of pass fishing, a breakdown or an emergency.
- 6. Kayak and canoe teams must stay together and fish from the same locations.
- 7. The holding of fishing holes or chumming of holes by another boat is not allowed.
- 8. All anglers are required to be at the awards dinner no later than 3:00 PM.
- 9. The ASHRAE tournament directors will resolve any disputes or interpretations of the fishing rules during review of fish photographs.
- 10. All anglers must be present for any door prizes or awards.
- 11. All anglers must abide by State and Federal fishing regulations.
- 12. All appropriate fishing licenses and/or stamps are the responsibility of each angler.
- 13. All fish must be released alive to constitute a catch.
- 14. Have fun and be safe!

Saturday morning April 27th, 2024 is an Honor Start at 7:00AM from anywhere you would like. No lines in the water until 7:00 AM! There is no formal check-in.
